## What technology to you use to run your business?

Quickbooks for financial. I use Google SketchUp most of the time, but for complicated things we use AutoCAD. And I use iPhoto a lot.

What is your favorite project to date, and why is it your favorite?

My favorite project I've worked on is my home. I worked for myself, it was very freeing, no second guessing. I got to design around my personality, find a place for all of my favorite things. The result was this whimsical and fun space I really love.

#### What are some of these 'favorite things'? Did you have some pieces that you just had to design a room around?

Yes. In my living room I have these big metal medical cabinets from the 1920s. I had originally purchased them for the film Requiem for a Dream, and when we finished filming I took them home. They're built into my living room wall now, and I use them to showcase my "Mentally Challenged" Toy Collection. (They're creepy or special-looking vintage toys from probably the 1930s-80s.)



#### What challenges did you face while working on this project?

It was a raw space, no walls. I had to carve out all these different spaces and manage the square footages. For example I wanted a walkin, but did I need the space somewhere else? It was difficult to juggle everything I wanted; in some places it came down to inches.

#### What did you learn from the project?

I learned to be really clear with the contractor. I had two floor plans I was working off of, and I hadn't made the final decision yet, and they went ahead and installed the plumbing for the kitchen without consulting with me. Basically they made the choice for me.
